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“Minim”ising the loss everywhere.



Having seen the high-tech, acoustic panels go up in the angled roof space, we can now see them on the horizontal flat ceilings in the rear hall and foyer. So not a minim, quaver or crotchet will be lost and a beautiful resonance will be maintained throughout the building. As you can see, it's very busy in the foyer area. I wonder what you call a collective group of plasterers-a "screed" maybe? Even though the gaps between panels are very narrow, they require a filler with acoustic blocking properties called Uniflot, specified by the manufacturer. Forcing the filler into every cm is painstaking work.



Two weeks ago, we touched on the imminent completion of the second serving hatch, from the kitchen out into the social gathering space. All that remains now is the thin wipe clean plastic layer, which can be ousted with just a flick of a craft knife, rendering the kitchen a lot colder than it currently is! The electrically operated shutter is next to be fitted. Right: The guys from M & M groundworks have been back on site and completed the side and back access paths for us. Vital for a fire escape route, maintenance, and cycle security.
