## The Birdcage has now flown!

With the internal scaffolding, or the “bird-cage” as it’s known now removed, we can see the fully unveiled width and height of our new church building. Trust me, it really is stunningly impressive. Stepping inside the building, you get a wonderful feeling of space and light and as your eyes track up the arrow shaped back wall, they land on the circular window feature with the light streaming through it. I doubt we will ever tire of it!



It is now time to progress the work on the Phase Two underfloor heating system and the rear chair storeroom is looking more like mission control at Houston. With the heating pipes’ manifold set in place some months ago, all the interface components to the heat source pump now need installing and hooking up. Here we see John fettling a giant shiny blender tank that is bristling with numerous inlets and outlets, earmarked by shiny copper piping. To explain, the “blending” function is to balance out the temperature of the water coming out from the boiler in the community phase one building and the water temperature being fed from the new heat source pump serving the worship hall and foyer areas. A constant temperature will be achieved.

Meanwhile back outside at the front of the building, our two friends from M & M Groundworks at Somerton are still slaving away creating our entry steps and pathways. Bricks and paving blocks are being expertly laid and positioned, working from their collaborative mind map. The bricks won’t be visible when the artwork is complete, but they play a key role in adjusting the conflicting earth levels.
